Is God calling you to invest deeply in your future ministry?

Research in Biblical Theology, Systematic Theology, Preaching, or Australian Church History is a great way to do this, and is also a significant contribution to the ministry of others.

Writing a thesis for a Master of Theology, PhD, ThD or DMin is a good way to do this, especially if you then publish a book based on your research.

It will enable you to invest in your own ministry and encourage others, promote godly and Biblical ministry, and, if you are called to this ministry, prepare for teaching in a Bible or theological college in Australia or overseas

I love supervising research students writing their theses for Masters, ThDs, PhDs, and D Mins!

I have supervised for degrees for the *Australian College of Theology*, and the *Asian Graduate School of Theology Alliance*. Recent research topics that I have supervised have included:

- The theological significance of circumcision in the Bible.
- A defence of expository preaching in cross-cultural settings.
- Why and how to do topical preaching.
- The contribution of the letters to Timothy and Titus to contemporary theological education.
- The Social Gospel movement in USA, and the evangelical response.
- The history of Anglican Evangelicalism in Victoria.
- Why do we think the Bible is translatable?

I only agree to supervise topics which are worth researching! I limit the number of people I supervise to three people at any one time. I try to provide not only effective supervision, but also prayerful personal support.

My own current research and writing is focused on wisdom for ministry, a practical theology of prayer, the history of expository preaching, and the integration of head, heart and hand in Christian life and ministry.
