Our research indicates that this soldier was Horace Barnes.

The list of passengers departing Liverpool on board the *Alfie* in 1911 included Horace, aged 22, bound for Melbourne.

Although his unit embarked from Brisbane, his mother, in details provided in his Australian War Memorial Roll of Honour Circular, noted that his place of connection was Carlton, Melbourne. She listed Rev. John Good, vicar of St Jude's during the First World War, as another source of information about her son.
