

CLARK, BOSWELL

Boswell Clark was born in 1896 in Sorrento to Edward and Marion (née Willis) Clark. They were a well-known family at Point Nepean as Edward's father, John Boswell Clark, was the licensee of the *Mornington Hotel*, Sorrento, for nearly 50 years.

Brought up in Carlton, Boswell enlisted in 1915 and was sent to France. He was wounded in action, suffering a severe knee injury and was declared medically unfit to serve. He returned to Australia in October 1916. His younger brother Hector is also listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll.
