

FIELD, T. F.

Thomas Franklin Field and his sister, Martha Mary, were born on the Central Goldfields in the 1870s to Thomas and Charlotte (née Millington) Field.

Later Martha moved to Melbourne and lived at 170 Neill Street and then at 419 Lygon Street, Carlton: she is listed as her brother's next-of-kin on his enlistment papers.

Thomas worked as a travelling salesman and enlisted in 1917 when he was 37 years old. He was seriously wounded in action in France and returned to Australia in 1918.
