

FROGGITT, F. W.

Frederick William Froggitt was born in Carlton in 1892 to John James and Mary Ann (née Grant) Froggitt of 849 Drummond Street, North Carlton. He trained as a pastry cook and enlisted in 1915. Sent overseas shortly afterwards, he returned to Australia only three months later, suffering from acute kidney failure.

Studio portrait of Private (Pte) Frederick William Froggitt, 1st Australian General Hospital.

A pastrycook from North Carlton, Victoria prior to enlistment, Pte Froggitt embarked with the Special Reinforcements from Melbourne on RMS *Osterley* on 29 September 1915. Whilst in transit he became ill and was diagnosed as suffering from acute nephritis. He returned to Australia on 4 December 1915 and was medically discharged.

This is one of a series of photographs taken by the Darge Photographic Company which had the concession to take photographs at the Broadmeadows and Seymour army camps during the First World War.
