

## HARRIS, F.

Our research indicates that this soldier was Ernest George Harris (1880-1976) and that the signwriter who decorated the Honour Roll was mistaken about his first initial.

Ernest lived in Lytton Street Carlton and worked over the road in the Melbourne General Cemetery. Men from four other Lytton Street families – the Dalys, Dawes, Knowles and Jago – also have entries on the Honour Roll.
