

JAGO, G.

George Edmond Jago was born in London, England, and emigrated, aged four years, with his parents George John Frederick Jago and Fanny Rowe, and three siblings on the *S S Glengoil* in 1883. Another five siblings were born in Victoria.

George grew up in Abbotsford and Carlton. He married Margaret Elizabeth Ashman in 1911.

A number of men who are listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll lived or worked in Lytton Street Carlton. The Daly, Dawe, Harris, Knowles and Jago families were all neighbours whose sons served in the AIF.

George Edmund's youngest brother also served overseas. Claude Melbourne Jago was born in 1895 and enlisted two weeks after his brother. He returned home, married in 1919 and died in 1922, aged 26. He is not commemorated on the St Jude's Honour Roll.

However his brothers-in-law, Arthur and Harry Ashman are included on the Roll.
