

## KEELEY, L. E.

Leslie Edward Keeley was born in Carlton in 1894 to Edward Martin and Rose Eleanor (née Maynard) Keeley. Leslie enlisted in 1914 and was sent overseas to the Dardanelles. He suffered various debilitating illnesses including rheumatism and was returned to Australia in 1915. The 1917 Electoral Roll shows him back living with his parents in Drummond Street, Carlton.

Leslie married Maisie Duffy in 1919 and the couple went onto have two children. He died in the Heidelberg Repatriation Hospital in 1951.
