### LOUSADA, C. (D.C.M, M.S.M)

Born in 1897, Cecil St Leger Lousada came from a large South Gippsland family of six sons and three daughters. His parents were Edward Charles Lousada (1815-1932) and Isabelle Beatrice Hall (1861-1917). He and two older brothers, Barrow Herbert and Aubrey George, enlisted in the AIF. Barrow was killed in action in 1916; Aubrey survived and is also listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll.

Cecil Lousada first came to St Jude's probably while he was working as a bank clerk in Fitzroy. He became a dear friend of the Good family and a valued Sunday school teacher.

#### Died of Wounds

Lousada – On the 11<sup>th</sup> April 1918, Gunner Cecil St Leger (DCM), 5<sup>th</sup> Divisional artillery, from wounds received in action, aged 21 years. (A loving tribute from the staff at St. Jude's Sunday School, Carlton.)
Lousada – Died of wounds on April 11, 1918, Gunner Cecil St Lager (DCM), 5<sup>th</sup> Divisional Artillery, aged 21 years, dearly loved friend of Rev. J Good and family, St Jude's Vicarage, Carlton.

#### Description

Gnr Lousada, who enlisted on 14 May 1915, was awarded a Distinguished Conduct Medal (DCM) in April 1917 "for conspicuous gallantry and devotion in volunteering to carry water across open ground, and through an extremely heavy barrage of artillery fire, to severely wounded men. He later displayed great bravery as a stretcher bearer, exhibiting a fine example of endurance and soldierly spirit."

In November 1918 he was posthumously awarded a Meritorious Service Medal (MSM). Between 23 September and 12 November 1917, he had been responsible for the production of operation orders and clerical work for the entire 5th Australian Division Artillery. The recommendation for the award includes "This NCO - devotion to duty and meritorious service, without previous experience, is worthy of special recognition." He died of wounds on 10 April 1918 and was buried in Querrieu British Cemetery, France.
