

MARSHALL, A. L.

Albert Leopold Marshall was born in 1889 in Richmond to Sidney Marshall and his wife Isabella Megson. The family of at least nine children variously lived in Richmond and Carlton. Albert enlisted in 1914 and was sent to Turkey. He was wounded in action at Lone Pine, Gallipoli, hospitalised, and subsequently served in France. His younger brother Percy enlisted a year later and is also commemorated on the St Jude's Honour Roll.

Albert returned to Melbourne in 1918. He married Susie Clark (1879-1930) a year later and the couple moved to Chelsea. He died in 1923.
