

MATTHEWS, H.

Our research indicates that this soldier was Henry Walter Matthews, born in Carlton in 1898. He was one of at least six children born to Elizabeth Buckland (1864-1929) and Walter George Matthews (1864-1929).

Henry attempted to enlist in 1916, under the name of Harry Matthews. However it would appear that the enlistment did not progress: possibly he did not have parental consent. He successfully reapplied a year later under the name of Henry Matthews and served in France with the 3rd Pioneer Battalion. He was returned to Melbourne in late 1918 and was discharged medically unfit with 'trench fever'.

Henry married Ivy Matilda Felton (1900-1990) in 1919 and they had six children. Sadly the marriage did not last as Henry became a violent alcoholic. Ivy successfully applied for a divorce in 1934. Henry died in Traralgon in 1978.
