

McNEIL, H. K.

Henry Kane McNeill was the second of three sons of James and Annie McNeill of *Barrapoort*, 32 Princes St, North Carlton. His father was a policeman, possibly stationed at the nearby North Carlton Police Station, 81-83 Canning Street.

Henry and his older brother, Neil James Kane McNeill, together with their father, enlisted in 1915 and served together in 4th Field Artillery Brigade. All three men returned to Australia. Unfortunately their surnames are mis-spelt on the St Jude's Honour Roll.
