

## REGAN, F.

Frederick Ogden Regan was the younger brother of Nurse Elizabeth Regan and Charles Graham Regan. Born in 1889 in Carlton, Fred was a permanent soldier, serving seven years with the Royal Australian Engineers, before enlisting in the AIF in April 1916. Prior to that, he declared his former trade or occupation was telephone fitter. Fred proceeded overseas to France and arrived back in Australia in October 1919.

His life ended tragically in Elwood on 10 May 1925, in a car accident.

## **IN MELBOURNE**

**MELBOURNE, Sunday.**

**Fred Regan, 34, and Frances Tracy, a young woman, were in a motor car early this morning. The driver of the car, when passing through Elwood, swerved to avoid another motor car. Regan and Tracy were apparently leaning out over the side, as their heads struck a telegraph pole. Both were taken to hospital, where Regan died. The girl is in a serious condition.**
