

## SALLOWS, A. W.

Alfred Walbourne Sallows was born in Launceston in 1896 to Thomas Henry Nicholas Sallows (1859-1930) and Sarah Frances Walbourne (1863-1948). Sarah and Alfred were married at St Jude's by Rev J Louis in May 1889, and their first three children were born in Carlton. Alfred and his sister were born in Launceston and then the family moved back to Carlton where three more children were born. The 1903 Electoral Roll shows the family living at 3 Pitt Street, Carlton.

Alfred enlisted in 1916, and served in France where he was wounded and sent to England. He returned to Melbourne in 1917 and was discharged 'medically unfit' with 'tubercle' (tuberculosis) in 1918. Alfred married Ivy Moore (1896-1968) in 1924 and the couple went on to have at least two sons. He died in 1971 at Heidelberg.

His two older brothers, Edward and Tasman, are also listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll.
