

SALLOWS, T. T.

Tasman Thomas Sallows was born in Brunswick in 1893, the third son of Thomas Henry Nicholas Sallows (1859-1930) and Sarah Frances Walbourne (1863-1948). The 1903 Electoral Roll shows the family living at 3 Pitt Street, Carlton.

Thomas married Ruby Eveline Ivey early in 1916 and the couple moved in with his parents. He enlisted and embarked from Melbourne in April. However Thomas suffered a 'cardiac episode' on board HMAT A14 *Euripides* and was admitted to a military hospital in Cairo. He was returned to Australia on HMAT *Karoola* in July 1916 and was discharged 'medically unfit'. Their son, Tasman Keith Anzac Sallows, was born the same year and a daughter born two years later. Thomas died in 1975, his wife Ruby the following year.

Tasman's two brothers, Edward and Alfred, also served in the AIF and are listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll.
