

SMITH, C. G.

Clarence George Smith was born in Carlton in 1894 to Clarence Coppin Smith (1866-1933) and Susan Lang Dawes (1871-1925). He married Marion Christina Wootten (1894-1973) at St Michael's Church of England, North Carlton, in September 1915 just prior to his being sent overseas to France. He returned in 1919 and the couple went on to have four children. They lived in Coburg for many years.

Clarence also served with the Citizens Military Force during the Second World War. He died in Fitzroy in 1961.
