

## SMITH, L.

Our research suggests that this soldier was Leslie Frank Smith who was born in Carlton in 1895 to George Smith (1857-1925) and Laura Maria Bulow (1861-1923). He had completed his apprenticeship as a tailor when he enlisted in 1914.

He was sent to the Dardanelles where he was wounded. He returned to Australia per HMAT *Euripides* (A14) in Oct 1915 and was discharged in 1916.

Leslie Smith married Eva Millicent Sanders (1895-1969) in 1920 and the couple went on to have a son and a daughter. They lived in St Kilda and Caulfield. During World War II, Leslie Smith served in the Citizens Military Force. He died in St Kilda in 1971.
