

## WALDRON, H.

Cherry Harcourt Waldron, known as Harry, was born in Carlton, the youngest of three children born to Ernest Arthur Waldron (1869-1950) and Blanche Louise Dorrington (1870-1928).

He enlisted in August 1914 and was sent to Gallipoli, where he was commended for courageously tending wounded soldiers under heavy fire. Harry later saw action in France, Egypt and Italy. He was wounded in Italy with severe burns and was repatriated home to Australia in 1918.

Harry married Zaidee Belinda Gofton (1892-1981) in 1920 and the couple had two sons. He died in 1952.


