

WOODGATE, J. H.

Born in 1896, John Henry Woodgate was the youngest of six children of Alfred Woodgate and Fanny, formerly Jerrett, born Bryant. His older sister Rose married Charles Courtney Appleyard (also listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll) in 1908 and lived in Carlton. It was her address that "Jack" used when he enlisted.

After the war, Jack worked as a storeman and lived in the inner suburbs of Melbourne, including Carlton and Abbotsford. He died in January 1961 and a wall niche at Fawkner Cemetery shows his military service.
