Our research indicates that this soldier was Stanley James Herron, and that the signwriter made a mistake in his initials when he wrote on the Honour Roll. Stanley James was born in Carlton in 1898 to Robert James and Mary Christina (née Fonsing) Herron. His two cousins, Alfred William and Robert Herron, are also listed on the Honour Roll. Their fathers, Robert James, and Alfred David Herron were brothers.
