

## LOUSADA, A.

Aubrey George Lousada was born in 1893 to Edward Charles Lousada (1815-1932) and Isabelle Beatrice Hall (1861-1917). He came from a large South Gippsland family with five brothers and three sisters. He and two brothers, Cecil St Leger and Barrow Herbert, enlisted in the AIF and fought overseas: Aubrey was the only survivor. Barrow was killed in 1916, Cecil died of wounds in 1918. He had been a close friend of the Good family and a Sunday school teacher and is also listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll.
