

FYNMORE, J.

James (Jim) Fynmore was born in Prahran in 1891, the second son of Thomas Edward Fynmore (ca.1833-1896) and Elizabeth Whan (1863-1946).

T. E. Fynmore came from a large and distinguished British naval family. His father was the third son of Lieutenant Colonel James Francis Fynmore (1793-1887), who had fought in the Battle of Trafalgar, as had his father Captain James Fynmore (ca.1763-1824).

James, his brother Thomas (Tom) and cousin Frederick are all listed on the St Jude's Honour Roll. Frederick had lived for many years in Carlton and returned there after the War. Later he was joined by his mother, Mrs F. J. Fynmore and his sister May and lived at 19 Keppel Street, Carlton. Jim returned to Sydney, Tom to Melbourne.
